Notice of Race & Sailing Instructions

(2024 NoR/SI)

AMENDMENT 1 (changes in red)

26 April 2024

Please delete 2024 NoR/SI 15.1 and replace with:

15.1 The aim is to sail a maximum of two WL races per race day. This can be increased to a maximum of three but no further than 1 race ahead of schedule.

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Please delete 2024 NoR/SI 20.3 and replace with:

20.3 In RRS A.5.2 replace 'series' with 'event' (changes RRS A.5.2).

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Please delete 2024 NoR/SI 22.3 and replace with:

22.3 Redress Limitations:

- a) A boat may only request redress when racing at an event; redress may be granted for this event only and shall not be given for a greater number of races than that boat completes in that particular event. If granted the redress the boat will be scored points equivalent to half of the fleet entered for that event rounded down to the nearest whole number (changes RRS 60.1(b) and RRS 62).
- b) Once a boat has docked out to start a race after being granted redress, no further redress will be granted based on the previous request (changes RRS 62).
- c) RRS 62.1(a) is replaced with 'an improper action or omission of the organizing authority or technical committee for the event'.

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Please delete 2024 NoR/SI Appendix A - UF 1.3 Rule 14.3 and replace with:

14.3 When there is contact that causes damage, or the umpires decide a boat has broken rule 14 and damage resulted, they may, without a hearing, impose a scoring penalty on any boat involved in the incident. The minimum penalty to be applied in such a case is 2 points for damage and 3 points for serious damage.

Please delete 2024 NoR/SI Appendix A - UF 3.1 and replace with:

UF 3.1 Delete RRS 44.2 and replace with:

44.2 Penalty

After getting well clear of other boats as soon after the incident as possible, a boat takes a Penalty by promptly making the required turn as follows.

- a. Before starting, or when on a leg of the course to a windward mark, or a finish at Mark WI, a boat shall promptly sail clear, and as soon as reasonably possible gybe and luff to a close-hauled course.
- b. On a leg of the course to a leeward mark, a gate, or the finishing line when finishing on a downwind leg, a boat shall promptly sail clear, and as soon as reasonably possible tack and bear away to a course that is more than 90 degrees from the true wind.
- c. On a leg of the course to mark WO a boat shall promptly sail clear, and as soon as reasonably possible:
 - i) gybe and luff to a close-hauled course, or
 - ii) tack and bear away to a course that is more than 90 degrees from the true wind.
- d. In a long-distance race, a boat shall promptly sail clear and as soon as reasonably possible do a turn, including one tack and one gybe.
